Our 2024 Speaker

Dr. Amin Madani is an endocrine and acute care surgeon at the University Health Network (Toronto, Canada) and assistant professor of surgery at the University of Toronto. He specializes in the surgical management of thyroid, parathyroid and adrenal diseases. He is also the Director of the Surgical Artificial Intelligence Research Academy (SARA), where he leads a multidisciplinary team of clinicians, data scientists, engineers and game developers. Dr. Madani's research focus is in surgical expertise and the use of technology to optimize performance in the operating room. Over the last decade, he has led the design and development of new innovations to improve surgeon performance, including platforms that incorporate machine learning algorithms, computer vision, augmented/virtual reality and simulation. Dr. Madani serves as the chair of the Surgical Data Science Task Force of the Society of American Gastrointestinal and Endoscopic Surgeons (SAGES), as well as the co-founder and chair of the Global Surgical AI Collaborative – spearheading efforts to bring the surgical and AI community together to disseminate surgical expertise around the world in a sustainable manner.
